Mrs. Lanci moved that the Board of Education return to the order of the agenda Mr. Haile seconded and the motion was carried 7-0.

PHYSICS OLYMPIAD 1ST PLACE OVERALL

Mrs. DeLauter presented Award of Honor certificates to members of Mepham High School's Physics Olympiad team stating on March 28, 2014, teams from 15 Long Island high schools gathered at SUNY Farmingdale and competed in the 26th Annual Physics Olympics sponsored by the Long Island Physics Teachers Association. This year was outstanding for the Mepham team of Chris Juchem, Brian Keohane, Jane Kogan, Kevin Mendez, Matt Waldmann, and their coach Mr. Bill Leacock. The team had their best year ever at the competition, taking first place trophies in four out of five events; Collision Course, Fermi Event, Pendulum of Doom and Physics Bowl and easily took the overall first place trophy, earning 63.5 points. Mrs. DeLauter, on behalf of the Board of Education, congratulated the Mepham Physics Olympiad Team and their coach.

NYS SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY ENTRY PROGRAM

Mrs. Schwartz presented an Award of Honor certificate to Calhoun senior Shanelle Mason for having paced first in the Biological Science Division of the NYS Science and Technology Entry Program. Over the past two (2) summers, Shanelle chose to perform research on Pain Reception at NYU Medical Center Langone Center under the direction of Alexandra Sideris, a Post-Doctoral Scholar. Shanelle's study involved research on neurons from two types of mice. One mouse had the CB1 receptor on brain cells, while the other did not. Tests were conducted on the mice to study the reactions of the mice to pain. The results of the study prove that mice with the TRPM8 receptor, but lack the CB1 receptor, are more susceptible to cold pain. Shanelle looks forward to attending the prestigious Sophie Davis School at the City College of New York in the fall. Mrs. Schwartz congratulated Shanelle on behalf of the Board of Education.

2014 NATIONAL COUNCIL OF TEACHERS OF ENGLISH (NCTE) ACHIEVEMENT AWARD IN WRITING

Mrs. Lanci presented an Award of Honor certificate to Mepham High School junior Jaime Marvin for having been selected as a winner of the NCTE Achievement Award in Writing. This year, 164 students nationwide were chosen as outstanding writers – 20 from NYS. All compositions were evaluated by national judges who looked for writing that demonstrated effective and imaginative use of language. Jaime participates in Cross Country, Winter and

Spring Track, is the assistant editor of *Fragments* and is an active member of SADD. She has been writing since the age of seven and has wanted to be an author for as long as she can remember. Mrs. Lanci, on behalf of the Board of Education, congratulated Jaime.

Rachel is a member of the Student Council, Key Club and Athletes helping Athletes Program. Rachel will study civil engineering at the University of Massachusetts, Amherst. Mr. Haile congratulated Rachel on behalf of the Board of Education.

CHANNEL 12 NEWS SCHOLAR/ATHLETE

Mrs. Goller presented Award of Honor certificates to Kennedy junior Beatrice Brown and Kennedy senior Dean Ostrofsky for having been named finalists in the American Museum of Natural History Young Naturalists Awards competition. It is the only national science competition that focuses on the natural world and on authentic science experiences that increase students' participation in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) fields. Beatrice is one of eight 11th grade finalists and Dean is one of ten 12th grade finalists. Dean's research project was titled "The Evolution of Venom Delivery Systems in Non-Front Fanged Colubriods." His work looked at the specificity of the structure of rear-fanged venomous snakes. Based on previously published literature, he differentiated if the system was specified or not and then looked at the natural history to find a reason why it was specified. Beatrice's research was called "Irene and Sandy...Oddity or Destiny? An Investigation of Factors Influencing Flooding Risks in the Long Island Area." Her research examined what type of factors influence hurricanes and associated flooding, including sea surface temperature and atmospheric circulation patterns. Mrs. Goller, on behalf of the Board of Education, congratulated Beatrice and Dean and their Advanced Science Research teacher Mrs. Barbara Franklin.

Monies from the 2013-14 interfund transfer, not to exceed \$50,000, will be used to pay for the abatement. Should additional funding be required, the Board will pass an additional resolution approving the amount.

CALHOUN HS

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Education declare the replacement of fixed glass with "hopper" windows in Calhoun High School's gymnasium an emergency situation due to health concerns. windows do not open which prevents the proper circulation of air in the space and often the overheating of the gym. The project is an ordinary contingent expense of the Bellmore-Merrick Central High School District. Monies from the 2013-14 interfund transfer, not to exceed \$25,000, will be used to pay for the replacement.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education approve the establishment of the Ellen M. Sheldon Memorial Scholarship in a variable amount funded by fundraising to be awarded annually to a Kennedy HS student who exhibits perseverance, bravery, courage during difficult and challenging life or learning hardships.

SCHOLARSHIP

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education authorize a transfer of an amount not to exceed two million dollars (\$2,000,000) from fund balance of the General Fund as of June 30, 2014 to the Retirement Contribution Reserve (GML §6-m), and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Education authorize a transfer of an amount not to exceed five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) from fund balance of the General Fund as of June 30, 2014 to the Employee Benefits Accrued Liability Reserve (GML §6-p, 2(a)).

Dr. Kaplan seconded and the motion was carried 7-0.

Mrs. Schwartz stated the Board just approved the establishment of the Ellen M. Sheldon Memorial Scholarship in honor of a Kennedy High School teacher and added that the Board really appreciates the feelings and spirit behind this scholarship.

The Board will discuss correspondence it received.

CORRESPONDENCE

Pam Banks stated the Calhoun Site Based Committee had discussed making Health a mandatory 9th grade course. She wants the Board of Education to strongly consider this idea.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Lisa Katz asked about the up-coming field tests.

Mrs. Schwartz stated Bellmore-Merrick is not administering them. The tests will be sent back.

Mr. DeTommaso stated field tests existed well before Common Core and after some discussion, it was decided they will not be given to our students.

Mrs. Lanci moved that the Board of Education convene its public hearing on the 2014-2015 School Budget. Mr. Haile seconded and the motion was carried 7-0. Mrs. Strait Régal advised the budget brochures are available at tonight's meeting. She presented an overview of the budget stating it is simplistic. The increase in State aid and the use of significant reserve funds has kept the tax levy at 1.866%. 12% of the budget is administrative, 78% is instructional and the remainder is for capital. Capital has additional money for needed purchases; half sized school bus, building security upgrades and technology. The district's vans are approximately 10 years old and will not

meet the state's stringent rules for use as student transportation. The budget to budget increase is 2.12%. In this budget, summer school was re-instated, there is an increase in the district's participation in the Long Island School for the Arts, replacement of computers is included and Project Lead the Way has been expanded to include ninth graders.

Mr. Haile moved that the Board of Education return to the regular agenda. Mrs. Lanci seconded and the motion was carried 7-0.
