The regular meeting was called to order at 8:10 p.m. Mrs. Goller led those present in the Pledge of Allegiance and stated she hoped everyone had a wonderful holiday and New Year. CALL TO ORDER

Dr. Kaplan moved that the Board of Education approve the minutes of the December 2, 2015 Board of Education meeting. Ms. Garguilo seconded and the motion was carried 7-0.

MINUTES

Mrs. Lanci moved that the Board of Education approve the Treasurer's report dated November 30, 2015. Mrs. Blane seconded and the motion was carried 7-0.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Mr. DeTommaso wished everyone a Happy New Year and added it is hard to believe it is January already. Before the break, he attended ten incredible winter concert performances where the students thoroughly enjoyed themselves.

He mentioned Calhoun students performed "Circle of Life" at the tribute for Mr. Smestad. Mr. DeTommaso continues to be awed by the charitable giving, donations and fundraising in the Central High School District. He stated new programs and district staples were presented at Kennedy's Curriculum Specialty Night for 8th grade parents and students. Individualized learning helps students find their passion. The district's move to 21st Century facilities will only enhance our students' experiences. The Board recognized Kennedy's Boys Volleyball team and their coach earlier this evening. The Advanced Science Research (ASR) Program produced two semi-finalists from Kennedy this year, Rachel Mashal and Sarah Moussavi. He congratulated all the students involved in the program throughout the district's three high schools. He added kudos to the principals, teachers, and other staff. Tomorrow, five BMCHSD students were chosen to participate in the Long Island Psychology Fair. Mr. DeTommaso mentioned some important dates noted on the agenda and was advised Calhoun's spring production is "Midsummer Jersey."

STUDENT REPRESENTATIVES

Derek Baumann stated in December MAP students learned the basics of ceramics, toured electric cars in West Islip and listened to a presentation about the effects of alcohol on brain development. He went to the United Nations (UN) in Manhattan and discovered the UN has its own zip code. MAP students also took a trip to Bounce Park in Syosset, wrapped gifts for children in homeless shelters, dressed up as elves for the Holiday Party on December 19th, collected socks, hats, and gloves and sent holiday cards to soldiers overseas. Three MAP students graduated in January, 2016.

McKayla Cates stated Mepham's toy drive, in conjunction with the Bellmore Lions Club, was very successful. Mepham's Friends and Family distributed gift cards and students performed "A Christmas Carol." Mepham students participated in a poetry workshop, an interactive holiday concert and 92% passed the financial literacy test. A Mepham student received a college soccer scholarship. The Poetry Out Loud contest was held last month and those winners will compete at the next level. The Mepham Varsity Cheerleading team qualified to compete in Orlando, Florida, next month. Both winter concerts were outstanding and students are working on Martin Luther King Day of Service collections.

Alex Dobosh congratulated Kennedy's Boys Volleyball team and Kennedy's ASR's Intel semifinalists adding they are the 39th and 40th semifinalists in Kennedy's history. Students received a standing ovation at the winter concerts. Students performed at the Westbury Gardens and a flash mob at the Broadway Mall. A successful toy drive was held and treats were given out at the holiday party on the 19th. Currently, there is a clothing drive and collections are being held for Martin Luther King Day of Service. Kennedy's annual Trivia Challenge raised over \$1,000. He mentioned the winners of the PTA Reflections contest. The Curriculum Specialty Night was the also the date of the ASR Information Night. Winter sports are underway and, as a tribute, the wrestling room has been named after Coach Munich. GSA sponsored an assembly given by Mr. Jackson.
