Mrs. Blane seconded and the motion was carried 7-0.

#### PERSONNEL

Mrs. Blane moved that the Board of Education approve the Superintendent of Schools' May 4, 2016 Personnel Report as stated in the agenda. Ms. Gargiulo seconded and the motion was carried 7-0.

Mr. DeTommaso congratulated all of the tenure recipients.

Ms. Gargiulo also congratulated tonight's tenure recipients.

Mr. Haile thanked the tenure recipients for taking care of our children each and every day.

### **RETURN TO AGENDA**

#### **PRESENTATIONS**

Mr. DeTommaso gave a brief history of DECA and then stated we begin tonight's presentations with DECA awards.

### **DECA**

Ms. Gargiulo explained that Distributive Education Clubs of America, DECA, provides students with the opportunity to learn about different careers in business as well as develop various skills that they can readily utilize in any industry. Every year there is a regional competition where students test themselves.

Mr. DeTommaso stated when there is a quality program in which kids are developing the direction of the program, it will work. Bellmore-Merrick will always be much more than the statistics in any published listing. Students will forgot many things from their school years but will remember helping others. We are empowering our kids to become productive citizens.

### STUDENT REPRESENTATIVES

Mr. DeTommaso added this is the first time Relay for Life is a district wide event.

The spring concerts were very energetic. The "Legally Blonde" performance was truly wonderful. She thanked all those involved. Honor societies held inductions. Mepham students are participating in the "Relay for Life" next week and enjoyed the OVOM 5K Run/Walk.

Mrs. Blane moved that the Board of Education accept a donation of Weight Room equipment, valued at \$24,605, from the Calhoun Sports Boosters Association. Mrs. Lanci seconded and the motion was carried 7-0. Mr. Haile thanked the Calhoun Sports Booster for all they have done for the kids.

# **CHILDCARE**

**BELLMORE-MERRICK** BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education authorize its President to sign a three year lease agreement with Bellmore-Merrick Child Care Program for the use of space at the Brookside School to expire on June 30, 2019.

# EAST MEADOW DRIVING SCHOOL

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education approve an agreement with East Meadow Driving School for the provision of In-Car Driver Education instruction, with vehicles, for the summer, fall and spring semesters of the 2016-2017 school year. Per student cost will remain at \$560.00.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education approve an agreement with Education Data Service, Inc. for software licensing and maintenance services for the NY/Island Cooperative supply bids at a cost of \$9,000, and Skilled Trades & Ancillary services at a cost of \$1,990, for the 2016-17 school year.

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BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education approve the New York/Island Cooperative Supply Bidding Resolution for the 2016-17 school year.

NEW YORK/ISLAND COOPERATIVE

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education declare obsolete and approve the disposal of Grand Avenue MS English textbooks and paperback novels that are no longer being used or are in poor condition. OBSOLETE/SURPLUS PROPERTY

Mrs. Gargiulo seconded and the motion was carried 7-0.

Mrs. DeLauter moved that the Board of Education approve the establishment of Herbert M. Booth Achievement Award and the Virginia S. Booth Memorial Award at Kennedy High School in the amounts of \$1,000 to one art student and \$1,000 to one music student for a period of five years funded by family donations. Mrs. Lanci seconded and the motion was carried 7-0.

**SCHOLARSHIP** 

There was none.

Mrs. Gargiulo advised she is a coach on a baseball league for children with disabilities. Calhoun baseball players and cheerleaders have volunteered to be "buddies." If anyone is interested in becoming involved in any capacity, they should contact her. Games are held in Eisenhower Park.

**CORRESPONDENCE** 

**PUBLIC COMMENTS** 

Mrs. DeLauter moved that the Board of Education convene a Public Hearing on the 2016-2017 School Budget. Dr. Kaplan seconded and the motion was carried 7-0.

**PUBLIC HEARING** 

Mrs. Strait Régal and Mrs. Kate Freeman gave a presentation on the budget. The district sets the tax levy, not the tax rate. This year's budget was affected by LIPA properties that were removed from the tax rolls. The CPI for 2015-2016 was 1.2%.

Mr. DeTommaso advised the district will not be surpassing the Tax Cap. The cost of the bond is included in this 1.5% budget increase. District residents will qualify for a rebate.

Mrs. Strait Régal compared BMCHSD per student expenditure with other surrounding districts. A dramatic increase in state aid this year covers 16.02% of the budget. This budget maintains all current programs, adds Special Ed teachers, additional security, maintenance vehicle replacement, van for pupil transportation, Chinese language at middle schools and additional technology aids. The GAP Elimination was reinstated. The district is adding money from the Appropriated Fund Balance to offset the cost of the budget. This presentation will be on the website. Mrs. Strait Régal encouraged everyone to vote adding that she has had a passed budget in every year of her career.

Mr. Haile thanked Mrs. Strait Régal for a good budget.

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RETURN TO

Ms. Gargiulo moved that the Board of Education return to the regular Board meeting. Mrs. Lanci seconded and the motion was carried 7-0.

**OLD/NEW BUSINESS** Mr. Haile reminded everyone that it is important to vote.

**EXECUTIVE SESSION** On a motion by Mrs. Goller, seconded by Ms. Gargiulo, and carried 7-0, the Board entered into Executive Session to discuss a personnel matter at 9:45 p.m.

On a motion by Ms. Gargiulo, seconded by Mrs. DeLauter, and carried 7-0, the Board of Education reconvened into Public Session at 10:30 p.m.

**ADJOURNMENT** On a motion by Dr. Kaplan, seconded by Ms. Gargiulo and carried 7-0, the Board of Education meeting was adjourned at 10:30 p.m.
