

During the week of March 21tst, school counselors delivered a lesson on

Career & Personality Exploration to all Sophomore students via classroom sessions. Each classroom lesson lasted one period. The lessons took place during Global History classes. During the lesson, all sophomore students logged onto their personalized Naviance accounts. Naviance is the college and career planning software to which BMCHSD subscribes. Sophomore students were then guided to explore their personality traits and careers of interest using assessment tools available through Naviance.



Students were able to research a variety of career clusters including; Health Sciences, Marketing, Finance, Law, and Visual Arts. Through these clusters, many students were able to link college Majors associated with careers and a list of various colleges that offer those majors. ACT/SAT

All colleges and universities accept both the ACT and the SAT. While every student is different in their testing plan, it is sometimes suggested to take both the ACT and the SAT. This would give you a chance to look at two scores and determine which you performed better on. If one exam plays to your strengths more than the other, you then would focus your study time on that test.

APPLYING FOR TESTING ACCOMMODATIONS ON THE ACT

The ACT Corporation will only consider applications for testing accommodations after a student has registered for an actual exam. Therefore, we recommend that students register for the first exam they plan to take, very early in their junior year. Once a student has registered for an exam, they must bring us an admission ticket (as well as the release of records form found HERE) before we can apply for the students testing accommodations. This initial registration is for testing under standard conditions. Once a student has their accommodations approved they will be changed to testing under their approved conditions.

Please note the review process for testing accommodations takes approximately 8 weeks —we recommend that students apply for their accommodations WELL IN ADVANCE of the date they hope to test.
