PSAT Information

Students registered for the exam should arrive at **Kennedy at** <u>7:45</u> <u>AM</u> with #2 pencils and a calculator on Saturday, October 19th. PSAT scores will be in by mid-December. Your scores will be sent via the e-mail you provided on the college board. Your test booklet will be returned along with an answer key. This material should be utilized in an effort to prepare students to take the SAT Reasoning test later this school year for Juniors and next year for Sophomores.

College Applications Please be sure to fill out a transcript request form found in the Registrar's Office and indicate each college you intend to apply to. Then submit this form to the Registrar's Office with your activity sheet. Without this form filled out, counselors do not know to send your transcripts to the schools you are applying to. Please make sure that your colleges are entered in Naviance under the college tab in 'colleges I am applying to'. Lastly, don't forget to send your ACT/SAT scores to all of the colleges to which you are applying. Log onto <u>www.ACT.org</u> and/or <u>www.Collegeboard.org</u> to do so. Please see your counselor with any questions.

Financial Aid

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Students and their parents should complete and submit financial aid forms as soon as possible to ensure a prompt response from the colleges of your choice. Financial aid forms can be obtained at colleges official websites. The financial aid forms you should be considering are:

1.) FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid):

The majority of colleges of scholarship programs will require this form. There is no fee involved in filing. They are available now online at: <u>www.fafsa.ed.gov</u>

2.) TAP (NY State Tuition Assistance Program):

TAP is used for students planning to attend a New York state school either public or private. You will become eligible for TAP automatically by filing a FAFSA form. You will then receive a supplemental TAP form in the mail to complete. This will be done automatically unless you check the portion of the FAFSA in which you refuse to release information to federal programs.

3.) CSS Profile (College Scholarship Service Profile):

This form is required by a limited number of colleges and is used primarily to distribute each specific college's funds. Make sure to see if the schools you are applying to require this form.
