### Academics

- **Ray Adams** of **Calhoun** was chosen to attend Boys State. At American Legion Boys State, participants learn the rights, privileges and responsibilities of franchised citizens. The training is objective and centers on the structure of city, county and state governments.
- The **Calhoun Virtual Enterprise** team competed in the Regional Business Plan Competition on Jan. 27, and advanced to the next level! They were ranked in the top 40 on Long Island and presented a phenomenal business plan. Jordan Burr, Allison Flynn and Shane Linett represented the firm in their presentation.
- Kennedy Virtual Enterprise teams ranked top 50 in the country. SkySource is moving forward in the Business Plan competition. The team participated in a 10-minute presentation based on an executive summary of their company. Presenters included Jillian Agaliotis, Nicolas Bedoya, Samantha Einbinder, Jared Levine, Bradley Lieberman and Joshua Vayman. Additionally, SkySource is moving forward in the Finance competition in which they presented balance sheets, income statements and projections. Imperium will continue on in the Human Resources competition, which is an entire company handbook of rules and regulations.
- **Mepham's Virtual Enterprise** students, with a company called **Look**, competed in the Regional Business Plan Competition on Jan. 27. The team advanced to the next level.
- On Nov. 16, 42 of the top math students from Calhoun participated in the prestigious Mathematical Association of America's American Mathematics Competition (AMC). Top three scorers for the AMC 10: Fiona Wong, Jaclyn Dobbs and Iliana Waldman.
- **Christopher Luisi** of **Kennedy** earned first place in the Junior Science and Humanities Regional Semifinal Symposium. On Feb. 26, he presented his research, How Dietary Restriction Affects the Athleticism, Metabolic Rate and Lifespan of Drosophila melanogaster, at York College.
- The **Kennedy** upperclassmen **CyberPatriot** team earned its New York State first-place finish in the U.S. Air Force CPXIV competition. This marks Kennedy's fourth consecutive championship. Two additional teams advanced; a team of freshmen/juniors earned second place in the silver tier.
- The Kennedy ITEEA REACH team was named finalists. The team was challenged to create an adaptive and assistive device. It created a Thermal Kinetic Therapeutic Glove to help individuals with Raynaud's disease. The team won a STEM grant, a gift card and STEM supplies.
- Each year, the U.S. Department of Education honors some of the nation's most distinguished graduating seniors. **Kennedy's Brandon Lin, Chris Luisi** and **Desiree Rigaud** were named candidates in the Presidential Scholars Program. Each year up to 161 students are named Presidential Scholars.





- Student leaders from Kennedy took a civic engagement project on the road! Nicole Giordano, Beverly Kleinman, Alex Levitt, Savannah LoGiudice, Rachel Oppenheim and Skyler Poster visited Grand Avenue to hold a workshop on empowering the growth mindset in young females. The culminating activity was the creation of confidence boards that participants can display as a personal reminder of their incredible attributes.
- Kennedy's Science Olympiad Teams advanced to states at the Science Olympiad Regional Competition held on Feb. 11. Bellmore-JFK Team A finished in sixth place out of 40 teams with numerous individual awards. The strong team performance allows JFK to advance to the New York State finals March 18 in Syracuse, New York. Bellmore-JFK Team B finished in a very respectable 12th place, also earning multiple individual awards. The Science Olympiad Competition involves teams of 15 students that compete in 23 different science events. The teams from John F. Kennedy won 47 medals. On Calhoun's Science Olympiad Team, Erika Klein and Joe Fiscella earned sixth place in Cell Biology. Sundeep Kaur and Ivy Lian earned 10<sup>th</sup> place in Dynamic Planet.
- **The Bellmore-Merrick Broadcasting program** was named a 2022 Student Television Network Broadcast Excellence Award winner.

#### Arts

- Joseph Fiscella, an 11th grade cellist in the **Calhoun** Orchestra, has been accepted into the Long Island String Festival Association virtual masterclass. The masterclass is a select workshop that only a handful of students are selected for compared to the association's other general workshop offerings.
- Calhoun's On Tour Company presented "Treasure Island" on Feb. 5 and 11.
- Grand Avenue eighth grader Elaine Li has received a Scholastic Art & Writing Gold Key award for her self-portrait painting.
- Four Kennedy students received Gold Keys in the Scholastic Art & Writing Awards competition. Nikita Rodov was selected for her poem, "Roses," and Sarah Suss-Pardo was selected for her poem, "Eggshells." Beck Levy produced a self-portrait, "The Innocence of Youth," and Michael Papazis' photograph, "Bay House," was also selected. They move on to the national level and will be judged by industry experts to possibly be awarded up to \$10,000 in prizes.

- The **Ice Hockey team** completed the season with an undefeated record of 15-0-1 and defeated Valley Stream in the quarterfinals of the county championships by a score of 14-5.
