Academics

- Gabrielle David and Ian Klimov of Calhoun were selected as the Calhoun representatives in the National Council of Teachers of English Awards in Writing Contest. Gabrielle and Ian's submissions, which were reflections about a quote from Michelle Obama, will be judged by English teachers nationwide.- The national winners will be announced in May.
- Kennedy was named an International Technology and Engineering Educators Association 2023-24 STEM School of Excellence. As winners, Kennedy joins an outstanding group of schools that are impacting and making a significant difference in the lives of students though Integrative STEM (I-STEM) literacy.

He treated them to a one-hour performance of his original material and some classic hits from <u>Christopher Cross</u>, Billy Joel, Frank Sinatra, Christopher Cross, Stevie Wonder and more.

Athletics

- At the Nassau County indoor track <u>and</u> field championships on Feb. 7, **Mepham's Isayah Contreras** of Mepham-finished in first place in the boys 600-meter run finals with a time of 1:23.75. **Dominic Inzerilla** finished in first place in the boys 55-meter dash finals with a time of 6.62.
- Jack Levitt broke the Kennedy school record of 11' in winter track pole vault and placed second in the Nassau County championships.
- The Calhoun girls track and& field team clinched the Nassau County championship on Feb. 6 for the third year in a row. Danielle Lawrence broke the school 55-meter dash record in a time of 7.31 seconds, which claimed her spot at the state championships. Yolina Bastien won the long jump and clocked her ticket to the state meet as well. Sophia Hines qualified in the long jump and broke her own school triple jump record with a leap of 39'25". Hines is ranked at <u>Nno. 2</u> in New York State and <u>Nno. 20</u> in the nation.
- The Kennedy boys and girls basketball programs volunteered to offer a youth skills clinic on Jan. 20.
- The Kennedy baseball and softball programs held weekly skills clinics for 125 local children.
- The Bulldogs hockey team traveled to Buffalo Feb. 29 to compete in the state championship.
- Mepham varsity cheerleaders placed second at the Nassau County championship and 9th-ninth in the nation out of 87 small varsity D2 teams at the National High School Cheerleading Championship in Orlando, Floridat.
- In Calhoun boys track and field, Max Jose won the triple jump with a jump of 44' 8" and won the qualifier. Logan Schaeffler won the 1600 with a time of 4:28, topping Nassau County once again.
- Calhoun wrestlers Sean Gallagher, Dan Fauci, and Rob Bello and Sean Gallagher finished 6th-sixth in Nassau County in their respective weight classes. Reese Adams placed 2nd-second at the Long Island Championship.
- Mepham wrestler Jason Martin placed <u>4th fourth</u> at 190 pounds, <u>lbs</u> and Chris Notti placed <u>6th sixth</u> at 138 pounds<u>lbs</u> in Nassau County.
- Kennedy wrestler Brandon Goldstein competed in the state championship on Feb. 25. He is the first heavyweight in school history to make it to the states. He finishes a five-year run with the Kennedy wrestling program with All_-Conference and All_-County honors, a conference championship, and two-time New York State qualifier.
