March 2023 Academics

- Five Kennedy ASR sophomores won the first-place presentation award in the Northwell Health Medical Marvels Competition. Ellie Gelman, Jack Levitt, Mark Prainito, Jayden Simon and Mason Tso developed a professional, three-minute presentation proposing policies for mitigating climate change.
- One Kennedy REACH Challenge team earned first place and another was named a semifinalist in the ITEEA STEM Competition. - The **Bulldogs varsity ice hockey team** ended its run to states on March 6 at the Long Beach Ice Arena after a valiant effort.
