Academics

- Kaitlin Bondi represented Calhoun in the Partners for the Future Program at Cold Spring Harbor Laboratory. She presented her research earlier this week at an event honoring the students who worked in this program.
- Allison Alvarez, Sahara Partap and Morgan Schaefer of Mepham were named as recipients of the Students Building Bridges Award. They will be honored for their efforts in building bridges across communities and creating a more civil society at Long Island's Holocaust Remembrance Day virtual program on Thursday, May 5, at 7 p.m.
- Cougar TV broadcast its 50th episode of the morning announcements on April 1. A ribbon-cutting ceremony for the Cougar TV studio was held in our library. Student Preston Bowman and adviser Brad Seidman are instrumental in this club's success.
- Tami Cruz's eighth grade Science Research students at Grand Avenue recently participated in the inaugural South Asian American Women's Alliance Middle School Science Fair. All nine students were acknowledged for their hard work, while seven students also placed in the top four, as individuals or as part of a team. In the Biological Science category, Salvatore LoBrutto placed first and Tristan Bissoondial placed second. In addition, the teams of Daniel Lin and Joseph Litman, and Hallie Gillison and Temidire Oladeji received honorable mention, placing fourth.
- **Calhoun junior Danielle Dukofsky** has been selected as a winner in the Gilder Lehrman Institute of American History "In Their Own Words" essay contest. Students were tasked with exploring primary sources in the Gilder Lehrman Collection and demonstrating their skills in historical interpretation and textual analysis. She was awarded \$500.

Athletics

- The Calhoun lacrosse teams hosted a youth clinic for grades 2-8 on April 9.
- Hailey Guerrero of Mepham was named to the All-State team, one of only 14 players in all of Nassau County to be named. This honor is bestowed by basketball coaches in New York State to students in public, private and Catholic schools. Hailey was the conference player of the year in Nassau A1.
- Bellmore-Merrick's first **all-female flag football team** took to the gridiron in April, making districtwide history. Twenty-three females make up the roster, including 12 students from Mepham High School, six from Calhoun High School and three from Kennedy High School. They are coached by **Anthony Cracco**, athletic director, physical education teacher and coach at Mepham, and teacher/coach **Matthew Moody**.

Altruism

- **Calhoun's Senior Experience Fashion Show** was held on April 12 in the school gymnasium. The show raised funds for the Starlight Children's Foundation, a nonprofit organization whose mission is to deliver "happiness to seriously ill kids."
- The Leukemia & Lymphoma Society's Long Island Region announced the 2022 local Student(s) of the Year winners and Kennedy's Rylie Levine and Mackenzie Davis were named runners-up. They raised an astonishing \$80,334.49. They also won the Citizenship Award for volunteerism. The society holds a fundraising campaign that brings together thousands of students across the country from diverse backgrounds and experiences who are extraordinarily driven to reach their own personal fundraising best and, ultimately, help the organization fight blood cancer.
- Nicole Giordano, Beverly Kleinman and Rachel Oppenheim, students in Kennedy's School & Community Leadership Program, have been selected to receive the Students Building Bridges Award by the Jewish Community Relations Council Long Island.



- Katherine Orellana of Mepham achieved the rank of Eagle in the Boy Scouts of America program. She is the first female student to get the Eagle Scout award in Mepham. Only less than 8% of all the scouts in the program get this award.
