Academics

- From April 20-23, **Christopher Luisi** of **Kennedy** went to Albuquerque, New Mexico, to compete in the 60th National Junior Science and Humanities Symposium. Christopher presented his research, "The Effect of Dietary Restriction" and earned third place in the Biomedical Sciences category and \$4,000.
- Christopher Prainito of Kennedy was named a finalist in the NSPC Health Science Competition. He was invited to compete for top honors on May 18 for his research. We also would like to wish Christopher good luck as he is competing at the International Science and Engineering Fair in Atlanta.
- Merrick Avenue eighth grader Jordan Siegel came in third place in chess in the Middle School Esports League's spring season, finishing the regular season with a 6-2 record and a win over a student from Cleveland in the third-place match.
- Ryann Jordan, a junior in the Calhoun Advanced Science Research Program, recently received the honor
 of having her research with her mentor at The Icahn School of Medicine at Mount Sinai published. Her
 work in biosimulators is valuable as it creates models that contribute to the betterment of
 bioengineering and medicine.
- Merrick Avenue students participated in the Long Island Science Congress. Jason Lin and Mia
 Zampella attended the awards ceremony on May 24 for their project.
- Student ambassadors from **Merrick Avenue** and **Grand Avenue** visited Saw Mill Road and Martin Avenue elementary schools in early May to speak about their middle school experiences.
- Kennedy and Mepham leadership students visited Merrick Avenue and Grand Avenue eighth graders on May 20.
- Mepham senior Meryan Tuurman received the Science Teachers Association of New York State
 Outstanding Science Award. She was honored May 18 at the 23 Annual Awards Dinner. Her teacher,
 Neeru Partap, spoke about Tuurman's accomplishments on her behalf.
- Merrick Avenue student Miriam Gunsburg earned third place in the Long Island Language Art Council's annual Kenneth F. Gambone Writing Contest.
- Kennedy junior Alexandra Levitt and Joseph Fiscella from Calhoun won 2022 National Council of Teachers of English Achievement Awards in Writing. Alexandra received a Certificate of Superior Performance in Writing for her "Reflections on Binary Thinking."
- On May 20, each Bellmore-Merrick high school entered a team of eight talented coders into this
 year's kidOYO Code Conquest hackathon. Nineteen Long Island teams competed in all. This year's theme
 was the Peloponnesian Conquest. The Calhoun Code Crackers, coached by Caitlin Greubel, tied for third



place, and both the **Mepham Programming Pirates**, coached by **Brad Vogel**, and the **Coding Cougars**, coached by **Carla Petroro**, tied for seventh place. The **Kennedy Coding Cougars** also received a special award for best logo.

- Three Kennedy engineering students participated in a two-day engineering/architecture program, the Scale Rule, at Hofstra University to design a pavilion. Sarina Khan, Kassidy McGlynn and Alison Wohlstetter placed second overall. Sameer Khan was on a team with students from other schools and won best presentation.
- Five students won medals for their work at the Long Island Math Fair. Senior Christopher Prainito of Kennedy, along with Merrick Avenue eighth graders Ryan Kenny, Jason Lin and Jordan Siegel won bronze medals. Kennedy junior Luke Feldman won the district's first gold medal in more than 10 years. Each student wrote a research paper on a challenging math topic of their choice and recorded a video where they summarized their findings, then submitted their work before a panel of professors.

Arts

- Sean Mascaro and Michael Papazis of Kennedy were chosen for the annual Heckscher Museum's Long Island's Best exhibition. Long Island's Best: Young Artists at The Heckscher Museum is the only juried exhibition on Long Island that offers high school students the opportunity to show their work in a museum.
- On May 5, Calhoun's Gray Concert featured mostly vocal ensembles along with the Concert and Symphonic bands. Pulse began the night, then Chorale and Concert Choir performed.
- Mepham's Spring Concert was held on May 5, featuring the orchestras, band and wind ensemble.
- Merrick and Grand Avenue held their spring concerts and art expos in May.
- Calhoun's On Tour Company presented its fourth and final show for the school year, "Story Theatre," on May 20-21. On Tour Company successfully performed three major shows, Shakespeare's "Macbeth," Robert Louis Stevenson's "Treasure Island" and George Gershwin's "Nice Work If You Can Get It!" This is On Tour's first time putting on a fourth production in a few years.
- **Liam Osborne** of **Mepham** scored a 100 on his Level 6 Jazz Trombone All-State audition at last week's NYSSMA festival at Mineola High School. This is the highest grade at the highest level of difficulty on NYSSMA's scale.
- Victoria O'Shea of Mepham won the NYS School Music Association Award for Mixed Chorus.

Athletics

- The **Calhoun girls track team** competed at The University of Pennsylvania, and for the first time in a few decades, won its 4x400-meter heat and took home a coveted Penn Relays Gold Plaque. Members are Julia Baguiao, Sara Manson, Kelly Martin and Julianna Razza.
- The **Mepham girls lacrosse team** was named conference champions.



- **Mepham** sophomores **Jenna Dempsey** and **Olivia Meyer** were selected to represent Long Island at the U.S. Lacrosse National Tournament.
- On May 16, a large track meet was hosted by Calhoun which determined the division champions for girls and boys track. Each team won its division championship on May 17. They placed second in the county finals.
- Merrick Avenue seventh grader **Siddhangi Wickramasinghe** represented Calhoun May 14 at the Nassau County badminton playoffs. She earned All-County honors.
- Calhoun's Athletes Compassionately Educating Students, ACES, formally known as AHA, conducted several visits to Camp Avenue, Fayette and Old Mill Road elementary schools.
- Calhoun's Jack Rose represented Calhoun in the Nassau County boys high school golf playoffs on May 24.
- Calhoun boys lacrosse made it to the final four.
- The Calhoun tennis team won its conference championship and finished the season 13-1.
- **Mepham wrestler Yianna Foufas** is a New York State champion, freestyle state champion and a Fargo Qualifier champion. She went 5-0 with four pins all in less than one minute and one forfeit to punch her ticket to the Fargo Nationals.
- The Bellmore-Merrick Chargers flag football team defeated Lynbrook 12-7 to win the Nassau County championship.
- The Mepham softball team won a hard-fought game against Calhoun, coming back from a 9-3 deficit to win the Nassau County championship 11-10 on May 29.
- Kai Rodger of the Kennedy track team is a county champion in the 200 intermediate hurdles and 110 high hurdles. He also received All-County honors.

Altruism
