Achievements

- Hundreds of students from Calhoun, Kennedy and Mepham high schools were inducted into the school's individual chapters of the National Honor Society on April 9.
- Calhoun student Rachel Ross was selected as a News 12/Capital One Scholar Athlete of the Week. Rachel will receive a \$1,000 scholarship as one of only 30 students from Long Island selected for this prestigious honor.
- Merrick Avenue teacher Nora Sheppard is one of only 42 teachers on Long Island and 215 in the state accepted into the New York State Master Teacher program.
- Two Kennedy students senior Dean Ostrofsky and junior Beatrice Brown were named finalists in the American Museum of Natural History Young Naturalist Awards Program.
- Analisa Coppa, a seventh-grader at Grand Avenue, won first place in the seventh-grade division of the Long Island Language Arts Council's Kenneth F. Gambone Writing Contest.
- Mepham has been recognized as one of the top 100 high schools in the nation for promotion of personal finance education by the Working in Support of Education (W!SE) Financial Literacy Certification Program. This ranking represents the top-performing schools nationwide in the program's network.
- Mepham's Jaime Marvin has been selected as a winner in the 2014 National Council of Teachers of English Achievement Awards in writing.
