American Institute of Architects: Awards range from \$1,000 to \$2,500. Open to high school seniors accepted to an accredited school of architecture who: exhibit exemplary effort in architecture and/or design and maintain a high academic standard. LI2Day: *The Long Island 2 Day Walk to Fight Breast Cancer Scholarship* is designed to provide a one-time award of \$2,500.00 to a high school senior who resides with a parent, guardian, or relative who is survivor or victim of breast cancer or other woman's cancer. Student must complete an application including school, community and outside activities. Applicants must also submit a personal statement, letter of recommendation and must show educational effort. Maria A. Sciara Scholarship Fund: A one-time award of \$1,000.00 will be awarded to a high school senior who aspires to be a teacher and resides with a parent or guardian who is a survivor, or resided with a parent or guardian who was a victim of cancer (other than breast cancer). NYS Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) Incentive Program: The NYS STEM Incentive program provides a full SUNY or CUNY tuition scholarship for the *top 10% of students* in each New York State high school if they pursue a STEM degree in an associate's or bachelor's degree program and agree to work in a STEM field in New York State for 5 years after graduation.

Applicants must be enrolled full time in a SUNY or CUNY college, be ranked in the top 10% of their graduating class, be matriculated in an undergraduate program leading to a degree in STEM at a SUNY or CUNY, earn a GPA of 2.5 or higher each term after the first semester, and execute a service contract agreeing to reside and work in NYS for 5 years in a STEM approved field.

In order to apply, a NY State STEM Incentive Program web supplement must be completed.
