

Graduation Rate

The class of 2017 consisted of 279 students with a 100% graduation rate. 99% of graduates earned at least a Regents Diploma and 72% earned a Regents Diploma with Advanced Designation.

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Bellmore-Merrick Broadcasting

Housed at Mepham High School in the district's cutting-edge broadcasting studio, the innovative Bellmore-Merrick Broadcasting Program is designed to enrich the educational experience of high school students with career interests in broadcasting by providing them with real-world skills and experiences with high-tech professional equipment. Led by faculty with experience in the field, students begin by learning about communication theories and tools, gaining background knowledge of pre-production planning and technical experience with camera use, lighting, sound recording, and electronic editing. As students advance through the program, they shape and refine skills in reading and writing for media communications, interviewing, graphics design, and filmmaking.

CHAMP Culinary Arts

The Culinary, Hospitality and Applied Management Program (CHAMP) housed at Kennedy High School, in a state of the art culinary facility, will be an opportunity for students to explore the culinary and hospitality industry through classwork in advanced food preparation and food service management. CHAMP will take students from cooking and service skills to thorough training in every kitchen station, while providing students with realworld knowledge that will support them in any field in the industry.

On Tour

Housed at Calhoun, On Tour is the Bellmore-Merrick Central High School District's Theater Arts program. The program has existed for forty years and is one of the most rigorous and expansive high school theater programs in New York State. Acceptance to this highly selective program is challenging as students have to go through an extensive application process which is comprised of a written essay, an intensive interview, an acting workshop, and the performance of a Shakespeare text. Approximately 30 students per year are admitted out of a three high school student body of close to 4,000 students.

Virtual Enterprise

This program allows students to experience all the facets of being an employee in a business environment. They are involved in every aspect of the business – including human resources, accounting, product development, production, distribution, marketing, and sales.

Senior Experience

The Senior Experience provides students with an opportunity to explore a variety of career options including out-of-school internships and/or activities based upon the individual interests of each student.

Gilder Lehrman

Our school district has partnered with the Gilder-Lehrman Institute of American History so that each of our high schools can become a history-centered school and academic research center. Students have the opportunity to pursue an American History major by selecting a particular sequence of elective courses.

Advanced Science Research Program

The Advanced Science Research program provides high school students with the tools and experiences necessary to become scientists. Students master the art of the scientific method, which can be used in every aspect of their lives. Students excel in areas such as interviewing, presenting, writing, self-assessment, peer evaluation, organization, time management, and other activities that aid them in becoming scientists. Students also perform three years of intense research under the supervision of a mentor in their chosen discipline. All students complete a publishable research paper prior to high school graduation. Our students have been consistently recognized for their scientific work at international, national, and regional competitions.
