-Chips Ahoy used to say there's 1,000 chips in every bag. Can that really be true?


-We randomly select one boy and one girl from JFK. What's the probability that the girl is taller?




Kennedy Winter Concert



Last week, the varsity cheerleaders started off the season with a county competition at West Hempstead HS. The team is currently ranked 8th in the county.


This Saturday, the team will be hosting a competition for the county. We are excited to be the home to the first ever competition for both Grand Avenue and Merrick Avenue Middle School!
