

## <u>Health</u>



Over the past years, he has been traveling to different schools in the district to speak to students about fentanyl. Fentanyl is a synthetic opioid typically used to treat patients with chronic severe pain or severe pain following surgery. However, illegally made

fentanyl is leaking into different types of street drugs and killing hundreds every day. Mr. Riebl presented to the class and spoke about his own dealings with this dangerous drug, including people in his family affected by the drug. 
# **JFK Chess Society Holds Grandmaster Tournament**






# **Cougar Athletics**

It will only be necessary to provide a hard copy of the *Physical Examination, as well as, (where applicable) the Administration of Medication and Self Medication Release* forms to the Nurse in the school your child attends. Physical Examination Forms must be dated and signed by a physician. Physicals are valid for one calendar year until the last day of the month in which it was completed (a physical dated June 13, 2023, is acceptable until June 30, 2024).
