C. Adoption of Budget Proposition

PROPOSITION NO. 1 – CENTRAL HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT BUDGET

RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of the Bellmore-Merrick Central High School District, Town of Hempstead, County of Nassau, is authorized to expend the sums in the General Fund Appropriate of one hundred sixty-nine million, six hundred forty-five thousand, nine hundred fifty-four dollars (\$169,645,954) to be raised through taxation in the several districts included with the Central High School District after first deducting the monies available from state aid and other sources.

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education accept the Fire Marshalls' 2021-2022 Inspection Reports. (See attached)

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education approve a municipal advisor services agreement with Munistat to provide research and analysis at a cost not to exceed \$1,000.00. (See attached)

J. <u>Cooperative Bid – 2021-2022 – Nassau County Association of Buildings & Grounds</u>
BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education approve the following Cooperative Bidding Resolution for the 2020-2021 school year:

WHEREAS, it is the plan of a number of Nassau County Public School Districts, during the 2021-2022 school year, to bid cooperatively for the purchase of materials, supplies, equipment and repairs (the "Commodities"); and

WHEREAS, the Bellmore Merrick Central High School District (the "School District") is desirous of participating in the cooperative bidding of the Commodities, as authorized by General Municipal Law, Article 5-G; and

WHEREAS, this Board of Education has reviewed the Cooperative Bid Procedures ("Procedures") governing its rights and responsibilities should it elect to participate in the cooperative bidding of the Commodities;

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education hereby appoints the Superintendent or his designee to represent it in all matters relative above; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that in accordance with Procedures, the Board of Education agrees to award bid item purchases according to the recommendations of the Superintendent and the Boards of Education of the Cooperative School Districts, if such award is in the best interest of the school district. (See attached)

K. <u>Inter-Municipal Transportation Management</u>

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education approve the renewal of an existing Inter-Municipal Transportation Management Services agreement between Bellmore-Merrick Central HS District, the Bellmore UFSD, the Merrick UFSD, the North Bellmore UFSD and the North Merrick UFSD authorizing inter-municipal cooperation and assistance with and among each other for the consolidation of their transportation management services and administration of the transportation management by a single transportation coordinator for the 2021-2022 school year.

L. Non-Public School Transportation

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education of the Bellmore-Merrick Central High School District approve the provision of bus transportation to particular non-public schools for a period of three years starting with the 2021-2022 school year. This period of time will become irrelevant if an eligible student should register for transportation to the school in question during this time. The three-year period will restart once there are no longer eligible students in attendance. (NY State Education Law §3635.)

M. <u>Inter-Municipal Transportation Cooperative</u>

WHEREAS, a number of public school districts in Nassau County wish to jointly solicit proposals, together with the Nassau Board of Cooperative Educational Services ("BOCES") for pupil transportation services for the 2021-2022 school year (and any renewal period) in accordance with the applicable provisions of General Municipal Law;

WHEREAS, the public school districts and the BOCES have agreed to form a Cooperative (the "Cooperative") for this purpose;

WHEREAS, the Bellmore-Merrick Central High School District is desirous of participating in the Cooperative for joint solicitation of proposals for pupil transportation services as authorized by General Municipal Law, Section 119-0 in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Inter-Municipal Cooperative Transportation Agreement attached hereto;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education authorizes the School District to participate in the Cooperative; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Education hereby approves the Inter-Municipal Cooperative Transportation Agreement attached hereto and authorizes the Board President to execute the Agreement on behalf of the Board of Education. (See attached)

N. Special Counsel – Lewis Brisbois, LLP

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education hereby authorizes the Board President to execute an Engagement Letter with Lewis Brisbois, LLP, subject to final review by Ingerman Smith, LLP, wherein Lewis Brisbois is appointed as Special Counsel to the Bellmore-Merrick Central High School District ("School District") at the rate of \$225 per hour for the purpose of representing and defending the School District in connection with a lawsuit captioned as *Dominic Baldi v. ABB, Inc.*, New York County Index No. 190217/2020; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Education hereby authorizes the Board President to execute a Disclosure and Consent Agreement with Ingerman Smith, L.L.P. agreeing to joint representation as to counsel and guidance of the School District with other school districts named in the lawsuit in the form attached hereto on behalf of the Board of Education; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Education hereby authorizes the Board President to execute a Consent to Joint Representation with Lewis Brisbois, LLP agreeing to joint representation in the defense of the School District with other school districts named in the lawsuit, subject to final review by Ingerman Smith, LLP. (See attached)

O. 3020-a Decision

WHEREAS, per N.Y. Education Law Section 3020-a, disciplinary charges were preferred against a certain tenured teacher of the School District;

WHEREAS, the State Education Department assigned the disciplinary case a particular case number, that is State Education Department Case No. 35,619;

WHEREAS, a hearing was held and completed before Jay Nadelbach, Esq., the designated Hearing Officer in this matter;

WHEREAS, on April 5, 2021, the Hearing Officer issued his final decision in the form of the Opinion and Award regarding the case;

WHEREAS, pursuant to the N.Y. Education Law, the Board of Education is obligated to implement said decision;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education having reviewed the Hearing Officer's decision in the form of his Opinion and Award, hereby authorizes the implementation of the decision and terminates the tenured employee, known to the Board of Education in Executive Session, from his employment in the Bellmore-Merrick Central High School District, effective close of business April 9, 2021;

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of Education hereby authorizes the Superintendent of Schools to take necessary administrative steps for the implementation of the decision.
