## C. Indoor Worker/Student Occupied Space

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education re-affirm the practice of maintaining heat in all indoor worker/student occupied spaces, excluding processing spaces (freezers and coolers) and gymnasiums, at 68° Fahrenheit from October 15<sup>th</sup> through April 15<sup>th</sup>, and 65° Fahrenheit from September 15<sup>th</sup> through October 14<sup>th</sup> and April 16<sup>th</sup> through May 31<sup>st</sup>.

## D. Snack Vending

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education approve an extension to a vending contract with Dover Gourmet Corporation Vending for the 2022-2023 school year for the provision of vending services in the District via the BOCES contract. The District will receive a commission on total sales; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Food Services Director is the District's authorized representative as concerns this agreement.

## F. <u>Authorization of Virtual Meetings</u>

WHEREAS, the 2022-2023 New York State Budget Bill, S. 8006-C and A. 9006-C, amended the Open Meetings Law to provide for a new Section 103-a;

WHEREAS, Section 103-a of the Open Meetings Law allows for public meetings to be conducted via videoconferencing effective April 9, 2022, subject to certain conditions and limitations;

WHEREAS, the New York State Executive Orders 11-11.9 extended the suspension of the Open Meetings Law's videoconferencing rules until September 12, 2022;

WHEREAS, the Board of Education desires to take advantage of the flexibility offered through videoconferencing for its meetings;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that effective October 7, 2022, the Board of Education may conduct any public meetings via videoconferencing in accordance with Section 103-a of the Open Meetings Law, provided that all requirements of Section 103-a have been met prior to any public meeting which is to be conducted via videoconferencing; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board hereby authorizes the Superintendent of Schools to establish and post written procedures for public meetings held pursuant to Open Meetings Law Section 103-a on the District's website.
