

ADMISSION OF NON-RESIDENT STUDENTS

The Board of Education affirms that its primary responsibility is to provide the best possible educational opportunities for the children who are legal district residents and who are of legal age to attend school. Therefore, non-resident students may not attend classes in district schools, with the following exceptions:

1. Non-resident students may be permitted to attend the district's Preparation for Life Program on a tuition paying basis at the discretion of the Board of Education.
2. Non-resident students may be permitted to attend the district's summer programs on a tuition paying basis, at the discretion of the Board of Education.

In all cases the act of moving out of the school district boundaries automatically removes legal residency status for the student and parent. Non-residents are not permitted to attend district schools.

An exception may be made, however, for students who are in or entering their senior year of high school. The student's parent/guardian must submit a written request to the Building Principal to complete that final year of high school. This request will be forwarded to the Superintendent of Schools who may grant the request. No tuition will be charged if the student is granted permission to complete high school in the district, but the district will not provide transportation.
